Renee Logan said, "I think a good theme would be "senioritis at its finest".


Kaitlyn Neubert said, "Girls just want to have fun!"

ibly proud to be able to support these young ladies in their future endeavors and we owe it all to the amazing support of this wonderful community and our amazing Chamber Members who continuously support our cause."

In the past three years we have had 33 VHS seniors graduate with the Show Me Scholar distinction and of those 33 Show Me Scholars, the VCOC has awarded 25 - \$500 scholarships for a total of \$12,500! That is a substantial amount of scholarships in three years for a small school.

In addition to what the VCOC is able to award locally, the MO Chamber awards \$1,000 scholarships yearly and since the VCOC is a member, one of our seniors have been awarded the \$1,000 Mo Chamber Show Me Scholar Scholarship

every year, for an additional \$3,000 being awarded. This year's MO Show Me Scholar \$1,000 Scholarship winner was Jordyn Steffen.

So thanks to the Show Me Scholar program VHS seniors have been awarded an additional \$15,500 in scholarships in the past 3 years.

"Some people want to be teachers, some are going into medical, there are alot going to Linn Tech," Koch added.


Maybe it's because of their differences that Parrish says everyone "gets along really good," and they wouldn't mind spending more time together.

"Our lives are before us, our past is behind us, our memories are forever within




