Teacher Danny Barrack gave an excellent speech and received a big round of applause. It was well received by the senior class as each of them was mentioned and congratulated by Barrack.


Abrams Weider is the valedictorian of the VHS Class of 2020. Salutatorian is Dawson Wansing. Both spoke at the graduation as-


Wansing said the year has been challeng-





Rachel Slocum, you thought my Trig Class was going to be the death of you but you ended up doing really well and that is because you are a hard worker and you are smart.



What were some memories you were looking forward to making that didn't happen?




