
Weeks went by and Taylor kept "coinci-

Battle of the Bulls.

"He wanted to pick me up," Taylor said. "I said no."

Taylor was determined.

"Leading up to our first date, I was so nervous, I remember but excited to finally take her out on a date," Jat said.

She met him at the event with her mom and by the end of the night considered it the best date ever.

Before I even realize the ride I'm on, baby I'm long gone...

"We had the best date and I left that night feeling giddy," Taylor said.

"What I thought was funny though about this date was that she left me to sit by her mom and towards the end of the night we were together again," he said. "Time went on and I was ready to make her my girlfriend officially. Although she made me wait longer than I had planned I was pretty confident that sooner than later we would be dating."

celebrate the most exciting moment in our lives," Taylor said.


All in, Taylor began wedding plans immediately, and the one thing she absolutely would not compromise on was the photog-

media and fell in love with her work. The photographer had two open slots in September 2022. The couple knew one of those dates would be theirs, they just had to line it up with a venue.

"My mom, Jat and I toured one place before Red Oak Valley," she said. "I absolutely fell in love with (Red Oak). It was everything I was looking for and matched my theme, which was Country Chic."

Red Oak Valley was filled with the rustic charm, wood walls and elegant lighting that she was looking for and the amenities such as the farmhouse for the bride and groom, the Hen House for the ladies, and Hayloft for the groomsmen to get ready topped the cake. Having a date open that worked with the photographer sealed the deal — and the couple booked both vendors for Sept. 24, 2022."

"Shortly after we booked the Red Barn at Red Oak Valley we were told about another barn that would be built and finished right before our wedding date," Taylor said. "I took one look at the design of the new barn and knew without a doubt that the new barn (known as the White Barn) matched our theme perfectly."

The White Barn originated in Indiana and was restored on the property. It features dark wooden beams placed throughout, giving a modern rustic feeling that fit the couple's look.

"Once we switched barns, I adjusted my colors so that would they would complement the white and dark wood accents. My final color palette was blush and sage green with gold accents."

After the venue and photographer were booked, the 21-month countdown to the wedding day began.

However, Taylor began nursing work on the night shift and found that by the time she woke in the evenings, most places were closed.

"It became challenging for me to be productive," she said. "I came across Brittany Schaffer with Bridal Boss and quickly reached out to her for assistance."

Schaffer is a wedding planner/day-of

"I chose her highest package because I needed all the help I could get," Taylor said. "Brittany was my go-to girl. She assisted with the vendor booking budget creation and tracking (my parents were all for this one), day-of coordination, and most importantly a day-of time line."

Taylor knew what she wanted for her big day: a timeless, romantic, elegant feel. Space with soft lighting and intricate floral details. Candles incorporated throughout the venue.

"I wanted a romantic space that was an expression of us and our love for each other," she said.

Jat didn't have a vision of the wedding,

only the woman who would be walking down the aisle, and gave her creative leeway. "When it came to wedding planning, I

had no vision at all," Jat said. "I let Taylor do everything and design it the way she wanted."

He wasn't thrilled that the main color was pink, but in the end, he would have the girl. "I let her do her thing because I didn't

want to disappoint her," Jat said. Taylor decided hiring help was the fast, most effective way to get them where they

needed to be. "In order to execute my vision, I decided to hire a wedding designer instead of trying

to create it myself," she said. Her coordinator reached out to a wedding designer, Ab&Co. Taylor shared Pinterest

pictures of her fairytale wedding and Abbie Clonts made it real.

"Abbie took a huge responsibility off of me and my family's hands.

Ivory, lace, floral appliques...yes, please

Due to the long wait to the big day, Taylor hired vendors before choosing a gown. In January 2022, eight months before the big day, she went to Breeze Bridal in Columbia to pick the perfect dress.

'On the drive up, I described to my friends and family what I was looking for," Taylor said. "Lace and sparkle, I told them."

Pulling up in front of the wedding boutique, Taylor caught sight of the dress in the window.

"It was exactly what I was looking for," she said. "An A-line stunner with ivory lace, floral appliques intricately placed throughout the gown. The skirt of the dress was pure sparkle leaving me speechless as I tried it on. The cascading train was a fan favorite by many. The dress is romantic and glamorous and fit the overall vision I had in my mind."

She was narrowed down the selection between two dresses, but the second dress didn't make her feel the same giddiness as the one in the window.

"Tears fled my eyes as I said yes to the dress and I knew it would leave Jat speechless when he saw it for the first time," Taylor said. "Wedding dress shopping was truly the

most magical experience." As they were leaving the boutique, Tricia saw the workers placing the same gown back on the mannequin in the window.

"I think my mom had fallen in love with my gown more than I had and quickly pleaded her case to the worker as to why a different gown should be on display. "The dress was still on display five months after we had purchased it. I joked with mom that she hadn't pleaded her case very well."

The day of the wedding finally dawned. "After what seemed like years of waiting, Sept. 24, 2022, was finally here and it was the day I got married to my best friend,"

She was calm when she woke, with the sun shinning through the windows, showing what would be a perfect day.

Her wedding planner had the day's itinerary mapped out in 15-minute intervals, starting with the ladies reporting at 8 a.m. to the Bridal Suite to begin getting ready. Her ladies and her mom stayed by her side while the wedding coordinator handled everything.

"My job was to soak it all in and enjoy myself as I prepared for the biggest, most exciting day of my life," she said.

It had been 24-hours since the couple cut off communication with each other. Rather than a first look they exchanged letters.

"We wanted our first time seeing each other to be when I was walking down the aisle," she said. "I cried as I read his letter out loud for the videographer who was recording me to use as a voice over on our wedding video."

She later noted that a funny moment for her was reading Jat's letter — hand-written in both black and green ink. A vendor had informed her that he was writing the letter to her in his truck before he gave it to her. She said it was just like Jat to wait until the

At 4 p.m., Jat was waiting for his bride in the White Barn as A Thousand Years played and Taylor stepped through the entry way framed with stained glass windows in wooden doors.

"When the stained glass, wood doors opened, I saw Jat for the first time and everything around me became a blur," Taylor said. "I had my eyes on Jat and nothing else mattered to me at that moment. All my nerves had eased as I saw my future standing at the end of the aisle, waiting for me.

Jat had set aside his blue jeans and ball cap for a full tuxedo.

"I was speechless," Taylor said. "Seeing Jat in a tux was a different look than I had ever seen before."

She hadn't given him any hints about her dress.

"When I saw Taylor walking down the aisle I was shocked," Jat said. "I had no idea what to expect when it came to dress, but when I saw her I was speechless. At that moment, the nerves were gone and I was just ready to spend the rest of my life with her."

Away. Followed by a father/daughter dance to I Loved Her First by Heartland and a mother/son dance to The Man You Have **Become** by No Limitz.

"Looking back its so funny to me that we planned this big day for a year-and-a-half but when the day finally came it seemed like it lasted for only five minutes," Taylor said. "I hate how fast the day went by."

Nothing's ordinary anymore...

They were set to fly out to their honeymoon the following Monday morning. Taylor describes a funny moment when Jat asked her the night before they left for their honeymoon — what was the name of the country they were going to?

"He truly was just along for the ride," she said. "I love planning vacations and I was so excited to plan our honeymoon. Jat didn't care where we went so, of course, I chose the beach."

She Googled top-rated beaches in the world and Turks and Caicos came up in the top three.

"I ultimately chose Turks and Caicos because of the white sand beaches and turquoise water. We left the Monday after our wedding and stayed until the following Sunday."

The all-inclusive resort was the best and they spent every day relaxing on the beach and soaking in the quality-time together.

"Halfway into our honeymoon we were sent a preview of our wedding day from our videographer," Taylor said. "That was a special moment between us."

Like a feather flying high...

Five months after the wedding with time to reflect, Taylor says she would make some changes if she could do the whole thing over.

"It would be a smaller, intimate ceremony and then a big reception," she said. "I thought of that idea after the invitations went out and it was too late to change it."

Still, a big dream wedding with everything she wanted and only one minor

"I misplacing my lipstick is the only chaotic story I can think of," she said. "I call that a win in my book if that was if that was the only thing that went wrong on a wedding day."

The couple is renting a house from Jat's grandmother, Janie, and plan to begin building on their property in Freeburg soon. She is a registered nurse at St. Mary's Hospital and Jat is a union electrician.

asking to go on another."

Kaitlyn said she knew a little earlier. "I knew Parker was the one because when I was deciding where I wanted to go to college, he never told me that he wanted me to stay in Vienna," she said. "He always pushed me to do bigger and better things, which ultimately resulted in me moving away from him. He never made me feel bad about it or made the decision hard."

WEDDING PLANNING

Kaitlyn said that once the couple made their engagement, they did not rush the wedding-planning process. They were still in college, and she said she wanted to wait until they had both graduated to get married.

"I planned for the season after we both graduated college," she said. "The exact date did not really matter to us. I just knew I did not want a winter or fall wedding."

They made it just under the seasonal deadline when they got married a few days before the start of fall on Sept. 17, 2022.

Indecision struck Kaitlyn when it came to picking the colors. Her dilemma: pink or sage green. She kept going back and forth in the time leading up to the wedding.

"I really drove my mom crazy," she said. "My dad was the one that sat me down and really talked to me about the colors and overall theme of the wedding. He is a very thorough thinker, and he and I can really design things in our heads. We sat down in my parent's kitchen for two hours and drew out the entire wedding. After that, I knew exactly what I wanted, and we got right to work."

Parker did not face the same sort of dilemmas when it came to planning the colors and theme of the wedding.

"It's just not something I really thought about," he said. "Iknew Kaitlyn was going to go above and beyond planning it, and she did. All I cared about was everyone having a good time and being with our family and friends."

When the wedding day arrived, it did not have an overall theme.

"I'm more of an 'I like what I like" kind of person," Kaitlyn said. "I wanted my wedding to not be a 'country' wedding, but I also did not want over-the-top glam. I worked with the decorator and pretty much had a little bit of everything thrown together. It just looked so good.

It was a perfect mix of rustic, elegant and vintage. The bridesmaids wore black, the hall was all greens and neutral colors, while the bouquets for me and the girls

held all the color." Wild Thorn Floral and Design in St. James made the floral arrangements. Rented items came from Grace & Lace Wedding & Event Rentals in Freeburg.

Kaitlyn said that by May 2022, she had it all figured out.

"That summer, I did almost no wedding planning and was so relaxed," she said. "Even the day felt easy. Of course, I had a day-of coordinator that helped make everything flow smoothly. It was so nice not to worry about everything. I overprepared everyone way in advance. Everyone got a detailed itinerary. Deacon Brooks got a binder. My mom got a Powerpoint."

"I let Kaitlyn take care of it all," Parker said. "Once she starts making Powerpoints, I know that I should just let her do it."

Once the time came to walk down the aisle, Kaitlyn did so in a dress she described as "perfect."

"Growing up, I was obsessed with my Aunt Susan's train on her wedding dress," she said. "I would stare at her wedding photo, and I just knew I wanted one just like it. I wanted the longest train I could get and the longest veil that went with it."


Kaitlyn chose a moment from the end of the night.


